Urinary Tract Infections (UTIs)

Kidney Stones

 Stones in the kidneys, ureters, or bladder can cause irritation and bleeding

Systemic Conditions

- Systemic Lupus Erythematosus (SLE)
- Henoch-Schönlein Purpura: A vasculitis that can affect the kidneys

Coagulopathies

Hemophilia

Trauma

 Injury to the kidney or lower urinary tract

Medications

- Anticoagulants-warfarin, heparin
- Cyclophosphamide

Bacterial infections of the bladder (cystitis) or kidneys (pyelonephritis)

Glomerular Disease

- Glomerulonephritis
- IgA Nephropathy: Deposits of immunoglobulin A in the kidneys.

Vascular Causes

 Renal vein thrombosis or renal artery embolism

When endometrial tissue involves the bladder

Exercise-Induced Hematuria

 Vigorous physical activity can lead to hematuria/ myoglobinuria
